### THE SCHOOL AND STUDENTS

Hampton Roads Academy is an independent, co-educational, college-preparatory day school serving approximately 610 students in grades Pre-K through twelve. The school's inclusive mission attracts and welcomes students from across a broad range of racial, ethnic, cultural and socio-economic backgrounds. The average class size is 16, and there are 48 students in the Class of 2025.

## STATEMENT ON ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND HONORS COURSES

We recommend students take no more than three (3) Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors courses in the junior year and three (3) in the senior year. All AP-enrolled students sit for the corresponding examination. AP and Honors courses are not offered in the freshman year. Honors courses are available in math and science, as well as AP World History, in the sophomore year. GPA weighting is 0.66 for an AP course and 0.33 for an Honors course.

## SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

### CHRISTOPHER NEWPORT UNIVERSITY SUMMER RESEARCH FELLOWS

Each spring interested students apply to participate in the Christopher Newport University (CNU) Summer Scholars undergraduate research program in a wide variety of academic disciplines. Selected applicants then join a research team composed of a CNU faculty member and student. The culmination of the program is the presentation of the completed research at a symposium on the CNU campus.

### THE PHILANTHROPY COMMITTEE

The Philanthropy Committee teaches students how to evaluate grant requests and fund the various projects of local organizations. Students not only learn about the challenges faced by community non-profits, but they also learn how to determine proposed project viability based on sustainability, management, and story. The culmination of the Philanthropy Committee experience is the funding of local, non-profit projects.

### REAL-WORLD EXPERIENCE AND ACADEMIC CHOICE (REACH) INITIATIVE

The REACH Initiative enables students to engage in real-world learning through mentorships, internships, summer jobs, and community engagement, as well as offering students with an identified passion the opportunity to pursue a directed course of academic study in one of five focus areas: Applied Science and Technology, Environmental Science and Outdoor Leadership, Global Studies, Health Science, and the Fine Arts.

### RESEARCH METHODS AND BACE CERTIFICATION

The Research Methods class is a class designed to teach, encourage, and guide students as they conduct and present original research. In addition to generating their own, original work, students work on projects in partnership with universities around the country.

Students who take the Research Methods class are also eligible to participate in our Biotechnician Assistant Credentialing Exam (BACE) program. Successful completion of this certification program gives students the skills and credentials they need for employment in the bio tech laboratory.

### THE SENIOR PROJECT

Required of all seniors, the Senior Project asks students to identify an interest or passion beyond the school's curriculum, focus that identified interest into a proposal for sustained intellectual inquiry, and then execute the proposal over a protracted period (at least three months). The Senior Project culminates in a public presentation of the project.
