Required Forms and Identification

In accordance with Virginia State Law and the Virginia Department of Education, Hampton Roads Academy requires the following information:

- A copy of the camper's student health form and Immunization record (you can get a copy from your child's current school). Current HRA students will have a record already on file.
- Identification verification: copy of birth certificate, passport, child military ID, or proof of enrollment at a Virginia public school.
- **No Child will be admitted to camp without health and identity verification forms on file. This is a Virginia State Law and there are no exceptions.**

Confirmation

Once the application is complete and payment has been received, a confirmation email will be sent to each camper. Some camps require additional waiver forms which are available through the online registration, may be picked up at the office, or can be printed from our website.



Refunds & Cancellations

Some camps require a minimum number of campers in order to run. Hampton Roads Academy reserves the right to cancel any camp with insufficient enrollment. A full refund will be offered if this situation should occur.

Any personal refunds must be requested in writing two weeks prior to the start of the requested camp. **Twenty percent** of the total fee is non-refundable. Please allow two weeks to process the refund. No refund will be given if a camper is dismissed due to disciplinary action. Should camps be cancelled by HRA a full refund will be given.

Absence Notification

If your child will be absent from a day of camp for any reason, please call the Camp Office (757-884-9117) and leave a message. This message should include the following information: full name of camper, parent/guardian name, reason for absence and telephone number.

Pick-up Procedure

Hampton Roads Academy will be following all VDOE guidelines to ensure the safety and well being of our campers and staff.

Camp Drop-Off Process

- Pull up to Drop Off Area and remain in vehicle
- You will be greeted by a staff member
- Your child will then be escorted by a staff member to their assigned camp location

Camp Pick-Up Process

- Pull up to Drop Off Area and remain in vehicle
- You will be greeted by a staff member who will call for your child.

Special pick up during camp hours – Advance notice is required to ensure that your child will be nearby and ready for pick-up. Please call the camp office at 757-884-9117 or email at stangu@hra.org to make arrangements. Please follow the above procedures for camp pick-up.

Snack Time

Morning and afternoon snack breaks will be scheduled for all camps. Snacks will be provided, but campers are also welcome to bring their own snacks from home. Water will also be available throughout the day.



Lunch

Lunch will be served in our dining hall. All campers registered for Full Day Adventure Day Camp and Full Day Little Navigators Camp your camp registration includes lunch. Lunch options will be available May 1, 2026. If you are registered for a half day morning camp, there is an option to order lunch with your camp for \$45/week. Campers staying for lunch must either bring a bag lunch each day or have previously ordered from our dining facility. All campers will have a supervised thirty-minute lunch (11:30 p.m. – 12:00 p.m.) in our Dining Hall. At 12:00pm, the camp staff will escort all campers to their next activity. Students are encouraged to bring water bottles to use and refill throughout the day. Please make sure their name is clearly marked on all food and drinks. There is no refrigeration available, so please pack appropriate items in insulated lunch totes.

T-shirts

Each camper will receive a camp T-shirt. Please be sure to mark the size preference on the registration form.

If your child stays with us throughout the day, they will have a supervised thirty minute lunch (12:00-12:30pm) in our Dining Hall or at the picnic tables outside. A mandatory rest/quiet time (according to VDOE requirements) will follow lunch.

- A refillable water bottle.
- A complete change of play clothes, in a plastic ziplock bag labeled with the child’s name (this can remain at camp for the week, or can stay in the child’s backpack).
- A bath or beach towel that can be used to cover our mats during rest time.
